Family Involvement		
<b>Funeral Pall:</b> The funeral pall is the white garment placed on the casket or cremains at the beginning of Mass, reminding us of the white garment worn at baptism. Close family members, from 2-8 people, will be invited to assist.

<b>Presentation of Gifts</b> : Family members may bring up the bread and wine (the priest will invite the family at the appropriate time). 2-4 family members is the norm.

<b>Words of Remembrance (optional):</b> The Archdiocesan regulation is one speaker, no more than five minutes. Additional poems, songs, or words of remembrance can also be shared at the funeral home or at the reception. Please speak with the priest regarding plans.		

## **Guidelines for Receiving Holy Communion**

Who will be giving the Words of Remembrance?

In order to receive Holy Communion, one must be a practicing Catholic, not be conscious of any grave sin not remitted by a priest in the sacrament of Penance and have fasted for one hour. Anyone not receiving Holy Communion, including people of other religions, may come forward at communion time to receive a blessing, indicated by folding one's arms across one's chest.
