



**Notice to all staff, volunteers and members of the Church of the Resurrection and Resurrection St. Paul School:**

Howard County's Forest Conservation Program was implemented in 1993. To date, thousands of acres across Howard County have been protected in perpetuity through the creation of hundreds of forest conservation easements. Although some of these are located on public land, many are located on commonly owned community open space, and may also be located on private property.

Within the borders of Church of the Resurrection property are areas set aside as forest conservation easements. Please see the below map for the area of our forest conservation easements.

Certain activities within the forest conservation easement areas are illegal. Some common violations include clearing, composting, dumping of soil, lawn clippings, trash, waste, abandoned vehicles and appliances, mowing, building structures such as sheds, pools, and fences, formal landscapes, and all-terrain vehicle use. Forest conservation easements are not for these types of uses and will result in the ultimate destruction of the forest ecological system.

As a member of Church of the Resurrection and/or Resurrection St. Paul School it is your obligation to help protect the forest conservation easements within our property borders.
